What Is Atomic Radiation Doing to the Human Race?

Indescribable devastation is frequently predicted if plutonium or hydrogen bombs ever are used in war.

But peacetime atomic experiments may involve an even greater danger: Permanent and serious mental and physical deterioration of the human race. This could result from the effects of atomic radiation, even in minute amounts, according to some of the world's eminent geneticists.
